


#### BRAZIL'S AMBASSADOR TO ISRAEL

"Like Brazilians, Israelis have the same informality, and happy appreciation for life. That is why they like each other so much," says Brazilian Ambassador Moreira Lima.

The Brazilian Ambassador had never been to Israel before he was posted here in February 2003, just before the Iraq War. Upon his arrival he was impressed with Israel's modernity and has been very encouraged by the improvement of Brazil-Israel relations.

Ties have been strengthened in cultural and economic fields as seen in the exchange of high-level visitors in the last three years. Then Vice-Prime Minister Ehud Olmert visited Brazil in March 2005 and met President Lula. In May, Brazilian Foreign Minister Celso Amorim visited Israel and met with Olmert and Prime Minister Ariel Sharon. These important visits resulted in the reestablishment of high-level governmental contacts. For the first time, Brazil and Israel established a mechanism for diplomatic consultations, by signing a Memorandum of Understanding in May, inaugurated last December in Brasilia.

Negotiations between Israel and Mercosur (Argentina, Brazil, Paraguay and Uruguay) for the establishment of a free trade area started last February and the Ambassador hopes they will be concluded this year. A level playing field for commercial exchanges will boost Brazilian and Mercosur business with Israel, he says.

In 2005, Brazilian business delegations came to Israel on three different occasions: during the visits of the Foreign Minister, of the Minister of Industry and Trade, Furlan, and of the Governor of Sao Paulo, Geraldo Alckmin, now running for the Brazilian presidency in the coming elections, next October.

On the Israel side, a delegation from the Manufacturers Association of Israel accompanied Vice-Prime Minister Olmert on his visit to Brazil. It laid the groundwork for two Memoranda of Understanding signed last year with the MAI and the Business Federations of the States of Rio de Janeiro and São Paulo.

In January 2006, an important agreement to avoid double taxation entered into force between Israel and Brazil. For Ambassador Moreira Lima, it is an important instrument to boost more bilateral business and investment. Agreements for cooperation on agriculture, health and customs have also been negotiated, he said.



Trade between Brazil and Israel has grown from \$400 million to almost \$800 million in 3 years. Brazil is Israel's largest trade partner in Latin America. Brazil has presented record exports in the last three years, but Israel still has a surplus due to significant exports of chemicals and fertilizers. Exports range from meat, soy orange juice to equipment for cellular phone and jewelery. Avionics is one of the sectors in economic and technological bilateral cooperation. Brazil is the largest producer



of medium-size commercial aircraft in the world. Ambassador Moreira Lima brought Embraer to Israel to demonstrate the company's new family of 100 seat commercial jets.

Brazil is a "melting pot", having the second-largest Jewish community in Latin America. Two Brazilian TV stations have been covering daily events in Israel since the Ambassador's posting. Brazilian music, soap operas, and movies are very popular in Israel. Ambassador Moreira Lima launched Brazilian films, such as the acclaimed "City of Gods", at the 2003 Eilat Festival. Every year a Brazilian Film Festival is organized in Tel Aviv, Jerusalem and Haifa. Capoeira, the popular Afro-Brazilian martial art, is a part of the Israeli physical educational system. In 2005, there was the largest exhibition ever of Brazilian naive art in Israel, during the visit of FM Amorim. Last year, by invitation of the Tel Aviv Mayor, Ambassador Moreira Lima celebrated the National Day of Brazil in Dizengoff Square with thousands of people, an event which was widely covered by the media.

Brazil, with a population of 186 million, has a border with 10 countries with a length longer than the distance from Rio to Jerusalem. Brazil also has great historical experience in negotiating treaties and, according to the Ambassador "to make the best politics and

economics out of its geography, converting frontiers into cooperation areas".

Ambassador Sergio Eduardo Moreira Lima was born in Rio de Janeiro. He served in the Brazilian Embassies in Washington, Lisbon, in the Brazilian Mission to the United Nations, and was Deputy Ambassador in London, before being posted as Ambassador to Israel. Ambassador Lima and his wife, Ana Maria, feel "at home" in Israel. They say Israelis and Brazilians have the same happy appreciation for life, enjoy freedom, and are informal. Like Brazilians, Israelis are also a people from many different cultures. Ana Maria organized the traditional "Meet my Country" with the International Club. She visits hospitals, enjoys antiques and interior design, and has redesigned their home into an even more beautiful gathering place in Herzliya Pituach. Ana Maria has organized parties for the Governors of São Paolo, Rio de Janeiro, members of the Brazilian Parliament, Brazilian Ministers and other authorities at the Ambassador's residence.

Ambassador Moreira Lima and his wife have supported in Israel some philanthropic institutions such as the Tsad Kadima, which assists children afflicted with cerebral palsy.

They have a son and two daughters. One daughter, Juliana, is a journalist in Brasilia for Correio Brasiliense, specializing in Fashion, and has just received a scholarship for a Master's Degree in Fashion Journalism at the London College of Fashion. His son, Sergio, and daughter Patricia, live in



London. Sergio, is a graduate of London School of Economics, and works for Barclay Bank. Patricia has a public relations firm in London. All three children visit their parents regularly, enjoying their stay in Israel. They have been here twice, and will be visiting again in June. They also feel as much at home here, as in Rio.

Ambassador Moreira Lima plays tennis at Accadia in Herzliya Pituach with a group of diplomats and Israelis. There is a large Brazilian community in Israel with around 10,000 members. The Ambassador is always raising the profile of this community which strengthens Brazil-Israel ties. Among some of its prestigious members are the architect of Hebrew University of Jerusalem, David Reznik, and Myrna Herzog, the world-famous viola da gamba musician, whose Wind and Sea project of combining Villa Lobos and Dorival Caymmi songs was launched in one of the concerts at the Ambassador's Residence. Last year, Ambassador Moreira Lima distinguished Professor Samario Chaitchik, a Brazilian-Israeli physician and scientist, with the Rio Branco award, the highest decoration of the Brazilian foreign service.

The Brazilian government has a representative office in Ramallah, and has an Ambassador-at-Large to the Middle East. The Embassy has just opened an honorary consulate in Haifa. Ambassador Moreira Lima believes Israel can make an important contribution to the region and to the world in science and technology. The Ambassador notes the high level of the diplomatic corps in Israel, due to the importance of the region as a "nerve center". It can affect the price of oil, interest rates, availability of capital and investments, world tensions and so forth, so countries carefully watch what happens here. He maintains strong relationships with other diplomats, including those of Latin America and the Portuguesespeaking countries, Portugal and Angola. With Brazil's almost 200 million people, Portuguese is one of the most widely-spoken languages in the world.




Ambassador Moreira Lima periodically gives lectures at Israeli Universities, such as Ben Gurion of the Negev, The University of Haifa, The Hebrew University in Jerusalem, The Truman Center for Advancement of Peace, Tel Aviv University and has an upcoming lecture in June at Bar Ilan University. His lectures focus on Brazilian civilization and Brazil-Israel relations. He often mentions the participation of Brazil in WWII, with 25,000 soldiers, embedded in the American Army, where his uncle was a hero brigadier in the Brazilian Air Force.

He also recalls with emotion the ceremony at Yad Vashem, when the late Brazilian Ambassador in Paris during the Nazi occupation, Souza Dantas, who saved over 400 Jews, was considered a Righteous among Nations.

The Embassy services over 40 requests for consultations per day, and recently the Brazil-Israel travel visa requirements were abolished. Servicing over 2000 Brazilian citizens in Palestinian territories is also challenging for the consular sector of the Embassy. The Ambassador is encouraged by the high level visits in 2005 and 2006 and is looking forward to enhancing this trend.

Tourism to Israel from Brazil has grown strongly in the last two years, as Brazil is the world's largest predominantly Catholic country, with many Evangelicals as well. Arkia has begun direct charter flights to Brazil, and Ambassador Moreira Lima showed nothing but optimism for the future of Brazilian-Israeli relations.

#### HUNDREDS CELEBRATE

## QUEEN'S 80<sup>th</sup> BIRTHDAY

IN ISRAEL

"My family and I have had a wonderful time in Israel and we are sad to be going so soon: it feels like three months rather than three years since we arrived. I have been impressed by the strength and warmth of relations between Britain and Israel. I know that Tom Phillips is looking forward to coming back to Israel. I admit that I envy him for the job that awaits him as British Ambassador. My three years here have been enthralling, but I suspect that the next period will be even more interesting."

ritish Ambassador to Israel Simon McDonald hosted some 900 people at his Ramat Gan residence on Wednesday (26 April 2006) to celebrate Queen Elizabeth II, 80th birthday.

In a speech given entirely in Hebrew, Ambassador McDonald said: "This evening, we are celebrating the Queen's 80th birthday. We are celebrating her public life and the virtues she represents: hard work, loyalty, wisdom and commitment... We are also celebrating Israel-Britain relations. I believe that the relations between the two countries are stronger today than they have ever been... We are also celebrating our hope for a better future for Israel, which shortly will be celebrating her 58th Independence Day".

"This toast is therefore threefold: to the Queen and the President, to relations between Britain and Israel, and to a better future for Israel", said the Ambassador, who leaves Israel this summer at the end of his three-year posting.

Guest of honour, Israeli Foreign Minister Tzipi Livni, toasted the ambassador's "charm and dedication", and thanked him for his "profound personal contribution" to Israel-Britain relations. "We are going to miss you", she said, and was met by loud applause from the guests.

Among the guests were the chief rabbi of Tel Aviv, Rabbi Israel Meir Lau, Foreign Ministry Director-General Ron Prosor, Knesset members Rabbi Michael Melchior, Ophir Pines-Paz and Yoel Hasson, actress Aviva Marks and members of the diplomatic community in Israel.

Guests were treated to a display of photographs from every decade of the Queen's life, including her meeting Israeli presidents Chaim Herzog and Ezer Weizman at Buckingham Palace. Some 30 kilograms of English cheeses and a considerably amount of Scottish smoked salmon were specially flown in for the event.

iroshi Sasaoka, a General Manager of Business & Sales Department, Sharp Corporation International Business Group, was honored recently at a reception at the Ga'ash Spa during a 4-day visit to Israel.

Guests included the Ambassadors of Japan, Angola, Cameroun, South Africa, Sweden, as well as the Latvian Ambassador's wife. Also attending was MK Uzi Landau.

The market in Israel is between that of the Middle East and Europe, but the taste is definitely European. Israelis, however, prefer bigger Americansize refrigerators, compared to European size, and of course, Israelis like the newest technology.

Japanese and Chinese companies are locked in international competition, although the Sharp Corp. LCD TV market in Israel has exceeded all expectations. Israel also has been selected by Sharp to be the first country in the world to launch the 4-door hybrid refrigerator. This model, has more free space and special cooling technology, and is able to freeze at a lower temperature.

The top 2 Sharp sellers in home appliances in Israel, in terms of quantity, are refrigerators and then micro-wave ovens. Televisions are the third biggest-

selling appliance. Refrigerators which have an active-plasma cluster ion purifier cabinet represent over 50% of the Sharp Corp. sales. An advanced 4-door model is being introduced now, and there is such demand that there is a waiting list for delivery.

Micro-wave ovens, of which Sharp is number one in the market, has a new water cooker model due out by year's end. The number three seller is the LCD TV, with such demand now that it is also in short supply, especially because of the World-Cup Championship to be telecast in high-definition.

SharpCorp. hopes to bring its share of LCD TV's in Israel up to at least 20% in the near future. Israel has very strict environmental laws, and Sharp is dedicated to cutting down on CO2 emissions, encouraging its sales of solar panels, as well as other ecology-minded policies. Sharp is represented by Ralco Agencies Ltd. in Israel.

"It takes a lot more than talent, rhythm and stage presence for a group to survive in this industry for almost a decade" claims drummer Doron Raphaeli, the founder of the Israeli renowned group Tararam, "you need persistency, patience and a lot of hard work to make it happen, and even more to maintain it".

Since its inception, Tararam has done a lot more than maintain their success. For almost a decade, the group has toured nationwide in venues such as Suzanne Delal in Jaffa and the Yahalom Theatre in Ramat Gan. Television appearances have become routine, and those high profile shows, along with wonderful press reviews, have led to performances at every major Israeli cultural event. Annual "International Taglit Birthright" Gala Events in Jerusalem, The Former Israeli Prime Minister Peres' Birthday Event with Bill Clinton and numerous other world leaders and The Israel Beauty Contest on Channel Two are but a few of the events from the past year.

On an international scale, Tararam has done their share of touring. They were the feature act for both the opening and closing ceremonies of Israel's 2001 and 2005 Maccabia Games, The 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece, The World Exposition (Germany), The Performing Arts Festival in Costa Rica (summer 2004), The Annual General Assembly in Cleveland Ohio, The Lent Festival in Maribor, Slovenia, The Summer Festival in Bogotá, Columbia and more.

It all began in the fall of 1996 when The Performing Arts Festival in Acre contracted Doron Raphaeli to compose an alternative outdoor performance for their upcoming season. Ready for a challenge and influenced by the new rhythmical genre that Britain's internationally acclaimed group "Stomp" had introduced, Doron began a search for drummers, percussionists, dancers and singers. "The average dancer doesn't have a sufficient sense of rhythm for what I had in mind and as strange as it may seem, even the best drummers generally can't move around gracefully on stage. As a result, I auditioned dozens of performers before I was able to find a handful of versatile players that suited my expectations" Raphaeli explains. He entitled his innovative show "Drumming on Junk", and the eclectic group of performers, he named "Tararam".

Unsure of the exact direction that the show would take, Raphaeli tested out a variety of creative ideas which included the building of an old jalopy upon which the entire group drummed in the show's finale. The end result was a staggering success and "Tararam" more than lived up to its name which in Hebrew means "hubbub" or "commotion". "The group's energy awakened the audience's natural impulses to tap its feet, clap its hands and basically beat on anything and everything they could find on their way out of the theatre". Doron reminisces, "It was an electrifying experience, and that's when I realized that I had something really special going for me."



The group was chosen to perform at the 1997 Israel Festival of Stage Arts in Jerusalem, where they received a series of excellent reviews and high profile exposure and in no time Tararam became an unprecedented hit.

Tararam's latest performance entitled "Extazira" derives from a combination of the English word "Ecstasy" and the Hebrew word "Zira" or "Theatre in the Round". "The performance is an assault on all of your senses; it is one hundred percent pure energy" Raphaeli explains.

"Originally, Extazira was built for a quaint theatre in the round in the Tel Aviv Port where we performed on the same level as the audience and had the rare opportunity to look people straight in the eye and experience their reactions. This proximity allowed for a real connection between the performer and the audience, something that doesn't take place in a regular theatre. I know that this experience had a deep effect on the evolution of the show which is a blend of rhythm, music, movement, live vocals, and comedy.

We have since successfully transformed the show to a regular stage and in my opinion the show hasn't lost the intensity that we gained in the beginning. We learned a lot about what excites an audience, what makes them laugh and we have integrated these valuable lessons into the show."

For the past four years, Tararam's Extazira has performed worldwide before

audiences of all ages. In each country that they perform, the group represents Israel with honor. They receive unprecedented praise by Israeli and Foreign Ambassadors, Foreign Ministers and representatives of the Jewish and Diplomatic communities. According to audience reactions, Tararam's performances are exceptional successes. Touched by the reactions of audiences, Raphaeli notes that "over and over again, we are told by Israeli Ambassadors and diplomats that Tararam does more for Israel's positive image abroad in one hour than the entire Israeli Embassy does in a year. We always receive a warm welcome worldwide, especially from the Israeli Foreign Ministry, a type of family bond if you will. Truthfully, I understand their reactions to our show; our message is clear and simple. We show the world a side of Israel that doesn't get much coverage on the daily news. We represent the youth and vitality of the country, all which is good."

"Despite Tararam's achievements, I certainly don't consider myself an overnight success", Doron comments. "I don't believe in them. If you look closely into the history of the most famous talents, you will find that they spent many years working hard without recognition before they were finally discovered - it only makes sense. Tararam may have become a household name today, but for me, it is the summation of the first 20 years of my career as a


drummer. Actually it is more than that; according to my mother, my career as a drummer began long before I could talk, so we are talking a good 40 years. I have no doubt that my personal experiments with rhythm and drums had an enormous effect on the creation of Tararam. For me, it is not just a musical genre, but rather a way of life, an ideology. Rhythm begins within each and every one of us, it beats in our hearts, it keeps us alive. Rhythm surrounds us and resides in everything that we do, everywhere we go. Without it, we would cease to exist. Therefore, it is only natural that our performers spend more time drumming on their bodies than on any other instrument. If you ask me, it is the finest tuned instrument ever created."

Doron's 25 years of experience includes collaborations with leading artists such as The Gypsy Kings, David Daor, Dana International (Diva), Datz Duo, Liora, Yehuda Polliker and many other top Israeli performers. However, "After more than 15 years of accompanying other performers, I began to feel that I had had enough, that I was just doing more of the same. At that point I felt that it was time for me to take my music from behind the scenes to a different place."

This past year Tararam conquered the children's market in Israel with a new musical for children called "Tararam KidZ". 
